UPDATES ON LEGISLATION

Bill 26 (2016) — On April 20, 2016, the City Council passed Bill 26 (2016) out on first reading and referred it to the committee on budget. The purpose of the Bill is to support and promote recycling activities. It would offer a discounted disposal rate of 75% to recycling operation facilities up to a maximum of 1,250 tons of residue per year for disposal at H-POWER. To be eligible for the discounted unit charges for disposal the recycling operation facility must adhere to the following conditions:

- 1) Recover at least 2,000 pounds of recyclable materials per month;
- 2) The recyclable material shall be shipped off-island or incorporated into a new consumer product directly by the recycling operation;
- 3) The residue shall be a maximum of 25 percent of the weight of the recyclable materials recovered;
- 4) The residue shall be a direct result of the recycling operation;
- 5) The residue shall not be commingled with other waste delivery; and
- 6) The residue shall not contain any recyclable material.

The Director of Environmental Services shall determine and approve recycling operations that are eligible for discounted unit rates.

If passed, the bill would help to support many of Oahu's small locally-based recycling companies.

State Legislative Tracking:

HB 1753, HD3, SD2, CD1 RELATING TO MOPEDS — On May 3, 2016, both the State House and Senate approved HB 1753. Once the Governor signs the bill, it will become a law and take effect on January 1, 2017. The purpose of this bill is to improve public safety by strengthening regulations regarding mopeds. Among other things, this measure:

- 1) Requires the issuance of a moped number plate and tag or emblem upon payment of fees;
- 2) Prohibits the unauthorized transfer of current number plates, tags, and emblems for mopeds;
- 3) Requires an owner of a moped to affix the number plates and tag or emblem to the owner's moped;
- 4) Prohibits a person from operating a moped that is not in good working order on any highway;
- 5) Extends to mopeds certain police powers regarding the inspection of vehicles believed to be unsafe or without required equipment;
- 6) Prohibits a person from operating or parking any moped on a public highway, without a current official certificate of inspection; and
- 7) Subjects mopeds to annual certificate of inspection requirements.
