Legislative Update

Bill 43 (2017) – On July 12th, 2017 the City Council adopted Bill 43 (2017) CD1, relating to the maintenance of channels, streambeds, streambanks and drainageways. The purpose of this Bill is to impose strict accountability and amend the conditions a private stream owner is held to maintain, dredge and clear such stream. The Bill also clarifies that the Department of Facility Maintenance (DFM) is the authorize entity to inspect and notify the property owner to clear and maintain any stream, and failure and neglect will results to Civil Fines. Councilmember Manahan introduced this bill to address the long-running complaints of the residents against Honolulu Country Club's neglect on properly maintaining Salt Lake Waterway, which lead to accumulation of trash, decaying algae, foul odor and health concerns. The Bill was transmitted to Mayor for his approval and on July 25, 2017, Mayor Caldwell, joined by Councilmember Manahan, Salt Lake Neighborhood Board Chair David Yomes, community resident Stephen Kabei, and the Department of Facility Maintenance, signed the Bill into law as Ordinance 17-38.

Bill 6 (2017)— On July 12, 2017 Council adopted Bill 6 (2017), CD2, FD2, relating to mobile electronics. The purpose of this ordinance is to regulate the use of mobile electronic devices by certain persons. This legislation prohibits the viewing of a mobile electronic device while crossing a street or highway; unless, a pedestrian is making "911" emergency call. Violation fines for the first offense is \$15 to \$35; second is \$35 to \$75; and, third and subsequent violations within the one year after the date of first violation is \$75 to \$99. On July 27, 2017, the bill was returned and approved by the Mayor and will go into effect on October 25, 2017.

Bond Rating and Electrification of Transportation focus of trip to San Francisco



Budget Committee Chairman Joey Manahan attended bond rating meetings in San Francisco along with Mayor Kirk Caldwell, and City and HART budget officials. Honolulu has maintained bond ratings of Aa1 from Moody's and AA+ from Fitch throughout Mayor Caldwell's administration.

These excellent bond ratings result in lower interest rates for the city. Along with the bond rating meetings, Mayor Caldwell, Councilmember Manahan and city officials visited Proterra in Burlingame to tour their battery assembly line. Mayor Caldwell and Budget Chair Manahan were also treated to electric bus demonstration.

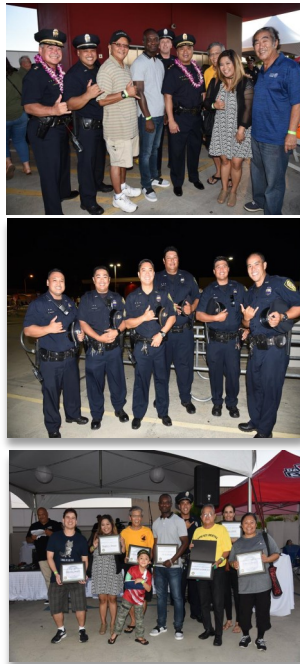
