On Thursday, June 25, 2020, 9:00 a.m., during the Hawaii State Association of Counties (HSAC) Executive confirmed the appointment of Councilmember Joey Manahan to continue his position as the HSAC President for Fiscal Year 2021.

This year, HSAC convened their annual conference virtually online. The HSAC annual conference was initially planned to be held on Hawai'i Island. However, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, HSAC cancelled their in-person conference and decided to continue their meeting online.

HSAC is composed of the counties of Hawaii, Maui, City & County of Honolulu, and Kauai and is a government sector lobbying association. Membership consists of the legislative bodies and mayors of each county. It is the Hawaii chapter of the National Association of Counties. The purpose of HSAC is to coordinate county programs in the best interest of the people of the State of Hawaii through cooperation of the legislative bodies of the several counties of the State; the creation of more practical and efficient county legislation, administration and procedures; the provision of a single source of information in regard to all counties which shall be available to the Governor, the Legislature and to all proper persons and officials and a general improvement in the conduct of county government.

Transportation initiative resume back to normal

As traffic begins to increase and people head back to work, the City and County of Honolulu's Department of Transportation Services will be restarting contraflow operations July 1 on Kapiolani Boulevard and Ward Avenue during peak rush hour times. Morning contraflow coning will resume from 6:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. Monday to Friday (not including holidays). Afternoon contraflow coning will resume from 4 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Monday to Friday (not including holidays).

DTS would also like to inform residents that parking along South King, Beretania, Date Streets and Wilder Avenue, will no longer be allowed to park in "No Parking Tow Away Zones" during peak A.M. and P.M. hours (6:30-8:30 a.m. and 3:30-5:30 p.m.). Vehicles parked in these Tow Away Zones must be relocated and will be properly enforced.

With traffic slowly starting to ramp up, DTS would like to remind drivers, pedestrians and bicyclists to travel safely. We would also like to encourage the continuation of telecommuting for employees if possible, to reduce the amount of traffic congestion, cars and collisions on the roadways. We feel that those who choose to telecommute to work help play a large role in the reduction of collisions, congestion and carbon emissions.

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

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Parking concession at Kapālama Hale

Beginning Monday, July 6 2020, there will be a parking concession at Kapālama Hale to ensure parking is available for people accessing services and conducting business at the Satellite City Hall, Driver Licensing Center, and City offices. An attendant will be on duty from Monday to Friday, 6:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

When conducting business at Kapālama Hale, parking validation will be available at a discounted rate of \$0.75/half hour for the first four (4) hours. Without validation, the parking rate is \$2.00/half hour. The parking rate was established in accordance to Revised Ordinance of Honolulu (ROH) Section 15-23, Off-Street Parking.

City campgrounds reopening, picnic permits resumes

City campgrounds reopened for permitted camping and permitted picnic events may begin.

City Campgrounds:

- The capacity of City campgrounds has been reduced to accommodate physical distancing guidelines between campsites. Generally, this resulted in about half of the campgrounds remaining available for public use.
- Regular campground procedures and rules apply. All City campsites are closed at least on Wednesdays and Thursdays.
- The Bellows Field Beach Park Campground is scheduled to remain closed until Sept. 4 due to unprecedented turtle nesting. Please avoid these nest sites, which are clearly marked, and report any illegal beach off-road driving or camping in this area by contacting the Conservation Law Enforcement Officer at (808) 285-9529
- Remember to dispose of your grilling coals in designated bins, don't dump them on the sand or near a tree. If there is no charcoal dumping bin, please douse your coals in water, stir, douse again then you can throw them away in a regular trash bin once they are fully extinguished.
- Camping permits continue to be made online through the City camping website: camping.honolulu.gov. Reservations open two weeks ahead of camping periods, every Friday at 5 p.m.

Picnic Permits

- No more than 100 people allowed for any outdoor event.
- A picnic permit is required for 50 people or more or for the use of temporary inflatable structures, commonly known as bouncy houses.
- Please contact the park location to begin the picnic permitting process. Those contact phone numbers are available on DPR's interactive map: bit.ly/OahuParkMap
